Nova Scotia Inclusive Education Year 1 Evaluation

In September 2020, Nova Scotia implemented a new Inclusive Education Policy. Researchers from the University of Ottawa have been engaged to provide a three-year rolling evaluation of the policy's implementation. This infographic summarizes the researchers' recommendations for improvements from their Year 1 Report, as well as the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development's response.

The department accepts all seven recommendations.

COVID-19: Use the policy to guide pandemic response.

The principles of the Inclusive Education Policy have guided, and will continue to guide, EECD's decisions and actions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Student Feedback: collaborate with students and not only for students.
