Students, families and teachers will see more school supports this September to ensure students have the help they need to be more successful in school. Government is investing an initial \$15 million to add more inclusive education supports provincewide.

Student and classroom supports in the form of Child and Youth Care Practitioners and Education Assistants.

Specialist teachers with expertise in supporting children with behaviour and learning challenges. These include Behaviour Support Teachers, Learning and Resource Teachers and Autism Teachers.

Parent Navigators to help families learn and understand what programs and services are available for their children, help them get access, and support learning at home.

Alternative Education Programs to engage and teach students in innovative ways that meet their unique needs. The programs will help students who require different, perhaps non-traditional, programming to help them be successful.

Student Health Partnership Nurses to work with primary health providers and school staff to ensure care plans for students are implemented.
