The Education Incentive Program for Black Students was established in 1965 by the Government of Nova Scotia to assist and encourage Black students to continue their education in high schools, community colleges, technical institutes, universities, and other approved post-secondary institutions. This program has evolved into the Scholarship Program for African Nova Scotian Students.

AIMS OF THE PROGRAM

Provide financial assistance to African Nova Scotian (Black) students so they will be encouraged to continue their post-secondary education immediately following completion of grade 12 in the Nova Scotia school system, develop leadership potential, and meet educational career and professional objectives.

AWARDS

Students are eligible to apply for one award per year, up to a maximum of four consecutive years, depending on the scholarship. Contact African Canadian Services Division for information at 902-424-2586.

- **University Entrance Scholarship (75% average or higher) - \$4,500**
- **Post-Secondary Award (Less than 75% average) - \$2,500**
- **Community College/Trade School Award - \$1,800**
- **Performing Arts Award - \$1,000** Only one student per year will receive this award.
(This award is available in conjunction with the University Entrance & Post-Secondary Award)

Students may apply for a scholarship/award each year, for a total of four consecutive years immediately following high school completion depending on program enrolled in. **Please note that the University Entrance Scholarship in the amount of \$4,500 is available for the first year only.** However, applicants who have received the University Entrance Scholarship their first year, may apply the following three years for the Post-Secondary Award. Students must successfully complete the first year of a program to be eligible for the second, third, and fourth year awards which are based on satisfactory academic standing. Students must submit an application each year to be considered for any scholarship/award.

UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

Valued at \$4,500, these scholarships are available to African Nova Scotian (Black) students who have successfully completed grade 12 in the Nova Scotia school system within the current year, and who have been accepted and will attend university in the academic year immediately following grade 12. Students who receive this scholarship can apply the next three consecutive years for the Post-secondary Award.

CRITERIA AS FOLLOWS:

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- An African Nova Scotian (Black) student with genealogical/ancestral connections to an historical African Nova Scotian/Black community; and/or
- An African Nova Scotian (Black) student is a Canadian citizen whose parent(s)/guardian(s) is(are) of Black African descent, and
- Applicant must be a resident of Nova Scotia;
- Applicant must be a Canadian Citizen;
- Applicant must be a graduate of the Nova Scotia School System;
- Enrolled as a full-time student in a recognized degree (undergraduate) program for the academic year immediately following grade 12

*The term "Black" is the original term that the Education Incentive Program for Black Students used, and it is the term that the Black Learners Advisory Committee used in their recommendation that the Nova Scotia Government "should provide scholarships and financial assistance to Black learners in recognition of achievement and need " (p.21) The term "Black" is used because many people of African ancestry in Canada and Nova Scotia refer to themselves as "Black," a term used to refer to a racial identity, rather than a colour. SELECTION CRITERIA

- Have obtained an average of 75% or higher in five grade 12 academic courses including the compulsory course of English 12 and any four others from the Nova Scotia school system (note that Approved Local Courses (ALC) will not be used in this calculation. *exceptions to this include Advanced Placement Credits, IB Credits and Advanced Courses.
- Have demonstrated leadership qualities through participation in community affairs, student activities and athletics
- Be recommended by the high school principal, vice-principal, guidance counsellor or African Nova Scotian Student Support Worker

Public School Program (PSP) Academic courses are used to determine a student's average. Exceptions as noted above include Advanced Placement, etc. It is crucial that each student review their course selection if they intend to apply for the University Entrance Scholarship. If a student does not have five grade 12 academic courses from the PSP, yet has an average of 75% or higher and will attend university, their application will then be considered for the Post-Secondary Award in the amount of \$2,500.
