

# Council to Improve Classroom Conditions: Work to Date

## March to June 2017 Overview

### Investing \$10.3M, Recommending More than 50 Changes

The Council to Improve Classroom Conditions was established in March 2017 to give teachers a voice in decision-making. Council met for 11 days, and for more than 80 hours between March and June.

Over those meetings, council made more than 50 recommendations. Government and school boards are working together to implement **all** of council's recommendations to date. (See *March – June 2017 Council Recommendations: Status Report*).

When the council was created, government committed \$10 million for council to invest in 2017–18, and an additional \$10M for 2018–19. Based on a request from council, government matched \$1M dedicated by council for an Inspiring Schools grants program.

This enabled council to determine how \$10.3M will be used to improve classroom conditions in 2017–18. Council has \$700,000 remaining in this budget year, and \$11.1M for 2018–19.
