**The Government of Nova Scotia defines community engagement as collaborative process aimed at strengthening partnerships and ensuring inclusive, transparent involvement of community members at every stage.**



# Why it matters now more than ever

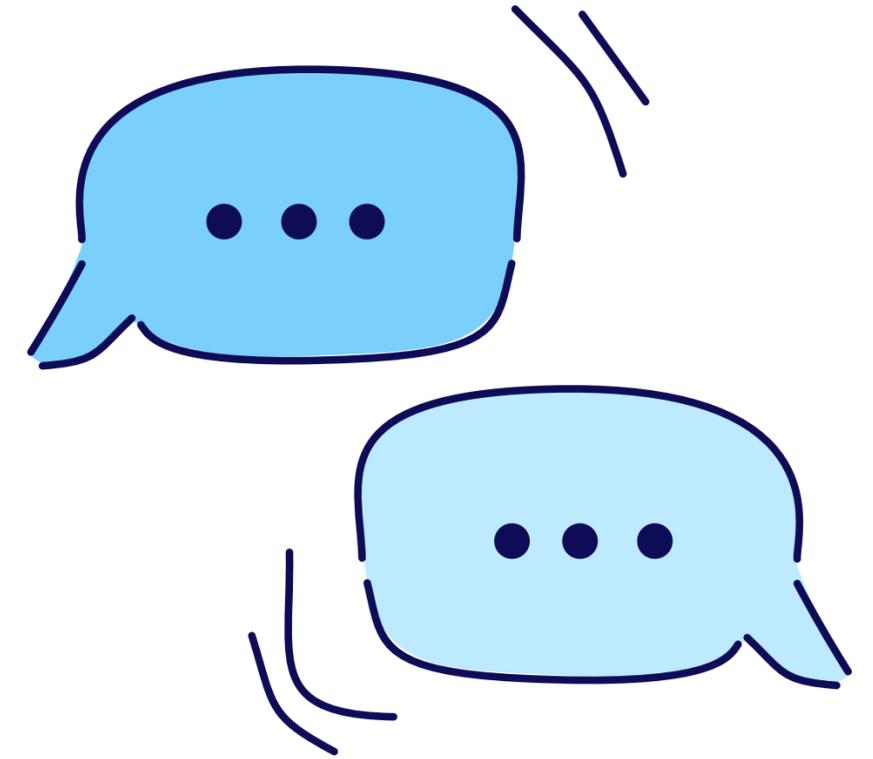
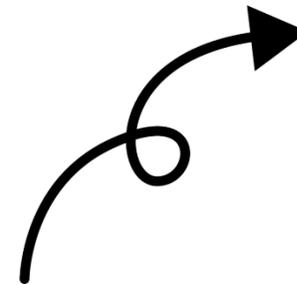
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- Schools were never homogenous AND demographics are changing rapidly
- Understanding the demographics and self-identification students helps paint an accurate picture of a school community
  - In 2024-25, 6% of students identified as Indigenous, 8.1% as African Descent
  - In 2020, Education integrated a non-binary gender option in the self-identification survey
- It is essential to know who students are and the communities you serve
- Engaging with diverse groups within your school community can help schools better support students

# Start with Gifts Not Deficits



- 01 **Everyone has gifts or strengths to contribute to their community**
- 02 **Focus on aspirations and abilities not what is lacking or wrong with a community** (e.g., incidents of violence, not enough time or money, etc.)
- 03 **See resources everywhere** - families, communities and schools are full of gifts to be discovered and engaged
- 04 **Value relationships and partnerships** - Strong and meaningful connections between people are the foundation of change. Collaborate in ways that demonstrate mutual respect and honour self-determination
- 05 **Speak and behave in an inclusive way** - words and actions shape how we see people, situations, and possibilities

# Community Asset Mapping

Asset mapping is the process of identifying and documenting the skills, capacities, resources, and priorities within any community.

## 1. Individual Gifts and Talents

*The gifts, skills, and talents of neighbors*

## 2. Associations

*Small, voluntary groups led by residents*

## 3. Institutions

*Organizations of paid staff  
(businesses, nonprofits, government)*

## 4. Physical Space

*Physical assets such as parks, lakes, etc.*

## 5. Economy and Exchange

*Spaces of exchange, barter, business*

## 6. Culture and Stories

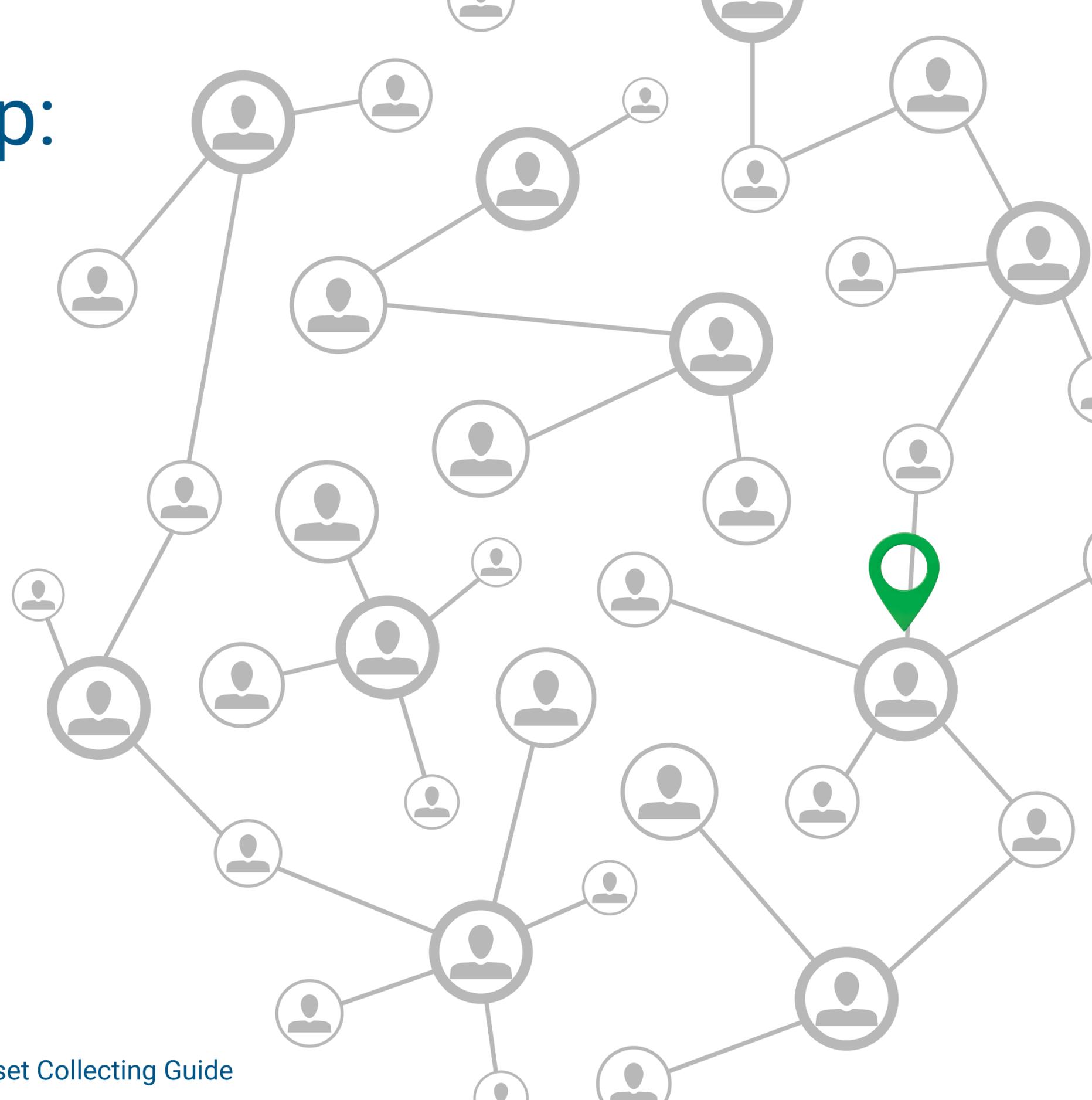
*Local stories, cultures, and traditions*



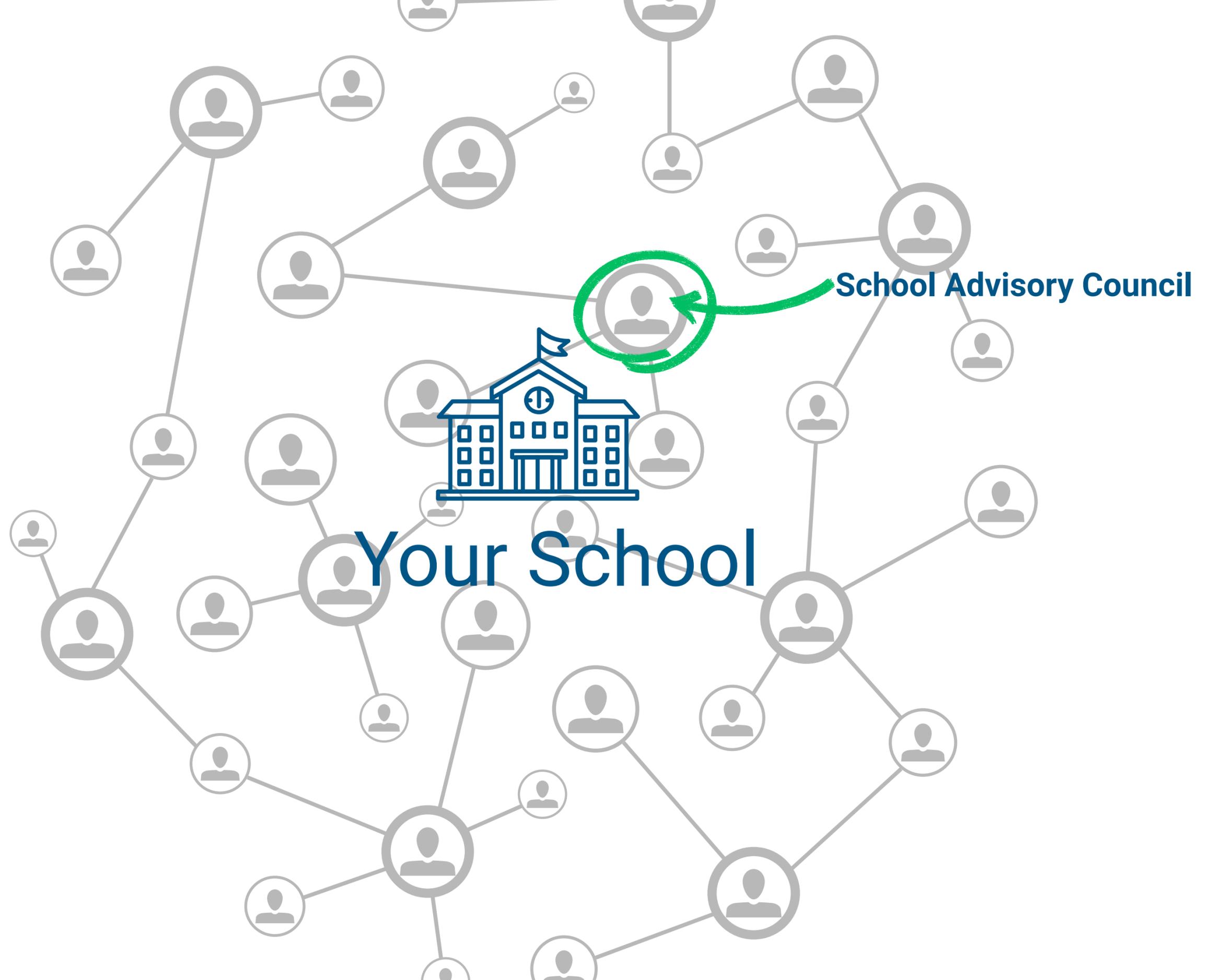
# Community Asset Map: Things to consider

- Although a geographic map may be helpful for context, it's not a traditional map
- Asset mapping cannot be done the same in every community (when you have seen one community, you have only seen one community)
- It's about connecting not counting
- Scale is important... the smaller the scale, the easier it is to build trust and relationships and to make connections

**What resources are available to your school community?**

Examples: Funding for eligible SACs, digital spaces like Facebook groups, donated items, volunteer hours, free advertising in community papers or newsletters, free room rentals, printing, etc.

**What history, cultures, languages, foods, and stories enrich your school community?**
