0	Listen to children when they speak and respond with interest and respect?	
0	Accept and value the children's ideas and suggestions?	
0	Set reasonable limits for behavior and respond to inappropriate behavior in a fair and consistent manner?	
0	Respond with care and understanding to a child who may be fearful, shy, upset, hurt, or angry?	
0	Encourage children to cooperate with each other, share and take turns?	
0	Display a sense of humor?	
0	Show flexibility in how they meet the varied needs of all children?	
0	Initiate conversations with the children other than instructions, commands and announcements?	
0	Encourage problem-solving?	
0	Encourage independence?	
0	Offer choices to the children?	
0	Redirect children when there is conflict?	
0	Bend down or kneel to speak to children at their own height?	
0	Engage in conversation with each child?	
0	Address children by name, including my child?	
0	Speak to each other, children, and you, calmly and respectfully?	
0	Supervise the space at all times?	



Daily Child Care Programs

0	Allow for both individual and group play?	
0	Offer choice of activities?	
0	Provide opportunities to explore the environment in different ways such as through music and movement dress up /pretend play, games, art, construction toys, and outdoor play?	
0	Encourage children to cooperate with each other, share and take turns?	
0	Have a consistent, yet flexible, schedule?	
0	Follow routines for rest, mealtimes, etc. in a relaxed manner?	
0	Not use television and video entertainment?	
0	Actively monitor children when they are using computers?	
0	Offer a variety of materials including blocks, dress-up, art and books?	
0	Include children and families from a variety of cultures and backgrounds?	
0	Provide drinks and snacks that are healthy and nutritious?	
0	Involve children in preparing simple meals and snacks?	
0	Support children to participate in basic life skills activities, e.g. washing hands, hanging up their own clothing, doing up zippers, etc.??
