The Work and Learn Early Childhood Education (ECE) Program allows Early Childhood Educators the opportunity to work in a licensed child care centre or pre-primary program in Nova Scotia while earning an Early Childhood Education diploma at NSCC.

Program Overview:

The Work and Learn ECE program will provide students the knowledge and skills necessary for working with infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and school-age children in a variety of settings.

After successful completion of your ECE diploma, students can apply for Level 2 Classification under the Early Learning and Child Care Act and Regulations.

Admission and Program Requirements:

- High School Graduation Diploma or equivalent.
- Be a Nova Scotia resident who is recently employed (12 months or less) or guaranteed employment in a licensed child care centre or pre-primary program in

As an **online program**, you can work and learn simultaneously. This program is asynchronous online, meaning there are no set class times. You can learn and engage with the course material when it works best for you. There will be opportunties to engage with your instructor and classmates in weekly discussions online. Each course follows a set start and end date, with assignment due dates provided by your instructor.

The ECE Work and Learn program combines both theory and practice. Work experience requirements are completed in your workplace.

one of the following counties: Antigonish, Guysborough, Victoria, Inverness, Lunenburg, Pictou, Queens or Richmond.

- Be working a minimum **15 hours per week** as an ECE in a licensed childcare centre or pre-primary program.
- Be a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada. Students with a high school diploma from outside of Canada may be required to provide English Language proficiency documentation. Requirements vary by country. View document and language requirements here.
