

Early Childhood Education Diploma -Accelerated Option

Accelerated Online Option Tuition Free - 2 Cohorts (March and May 2025)

Start date: Cohort 1 starts March 3, 2025 and Cohort 2 starts May 20, 2025
Typical length: 19- 22 months
Credential: Diploma
Location: eCampus (online asynchronous)

Learn while you work:

The Accelerated option is for Early Childhood Educators (ECEs) **currently working** in a licensed child care centre or pre-primary program in Nova Scotia.

Program Overview:

The Acclerated option is **asynchronous online**, meaning there are **no set class times.** You can learn when it works best for you. Courses are offered in a **prescribed schedule.**

Work experience requirements are completed in your workplace. If you have learning and work experience in the ECE field and can demonstrate your knowledge and skills, you may be eligible for **PLAR (Prior Learning and Recognition) credit.**

After successful completion the ECE diploma, students can apply for **Level 2 Classfication** under the Early Learning and Child Care Act and Regulation.

Employer Expectations:

Provide written verification from your employer that

- supports your participation in the program,
- agrees to provide you a minimum of 15 hours of work per week for the duration of the program,
- commits to supporting you in workplace practicum experiences

Admission Requirements:

- High School Graduation Diploma or equivalent.
- Possess one or more of the following:
 - Entry Level Orientation
 - Level 1 Classification
 - School-Aged Training Approval
- Be currently employed in a pre-primary or licensed child care centre with a mimimum l year experience as an ECE in Nova Scotia (equivalent to 1,080 hours or more a year)
- Reside in Nova Scotia and hold **Canadian Citizenship** or legal **Permanent Resident** status
- Have a Canadian Language Benchmark minimum score of 8 or equivalent in all categories (if English is not your first language)
- Minimum **15 hours per week working** as an ECE in a licensed childcare centre or pre-primary program

Funding:

Tuition, student fees, textbooks and other program cost are **fully covered** through funding from the **Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.**
