Pathways Option: For Newcomers to Canada residing in Nova Scotia

Tuition Free - Starts Sept 2024

Start date: September 2024

Typical length: 3.5 years

Learn while you work:

The Pathways option is for **newcomers to Canada** who **reside in Nova Scotia** and are **currently working** or **want to work** as an Early Childhood Educator (ECE) in a licensed childcare centre or pre-primary program.

Program Overview:

The Pathways option is **part-time** and includes the following:

- English Language Readiness Module: Before starting the ECE diploma courses, you will spend 16 weeks focusing on your English language skills in an online learning module.
- Language Proficiency: When you start the program, you must be able to demonstrate a Canadian Language Benchmark (CLB) 6 level. By the end of the ECE program, you must be at a CLB 8 level
- Flexible Learning: The program is asynchronous online, meaning there are no fixed class times. You can learn when it suits you best. Courses will follow a prescribed schedule.
- PLAR (Prior Learning and Recognition): If you already have prior learning and work experience as an ECE, you may receive credit for it through our PLAR process.

Admission requirements:

- High School Graduation Diploma or equivalent.
- Be a newcomer to Nova Scotia. An immigrant or refugee with protected person status with legal permanent resident status, or a recent Canadian citizen, who has lived in Canada for less than 5 years (a temporary foreign worker, an international student, or persons in Canada on a temporary resident visa is not eligible)
- Have a minimum of a Canadian Language
 Benchmark (CLB) 6 or higher level in all categories
 by the start of the program.
- Be currently employed or seeking employment in Nova Scotia in a licensed child care centre or pre-primary program.
- Be able to work a minimum of 15 hours per week while in the ECE program with the ability to complete work experiences in your place of work.

Priority admission will be given to those who have completed the Immigrant Services Association of Nova Scotia (ISANS) **Bridging the Gap** program.

Funding:

Tuition, student fees, textbooks and other program cost are fully covered through funding from the **Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.**
