Learn while you work:

Mi'kmaw Early Childhood Educators (ECEs) play an integral role in early learning environments providing culturally responsive education, understanding, family and community supports.

The **Mi'kmaw Accelerated** option is for ECEs currently working in a licensed child care centre, pre-primary program, Mi'kmaw Preschool/Daycare or Jordan Principle Support for Early Years in Nova Scotia.

Program Overview:

The Mi'kmaw Accelerated option is asynchronous online, meaning there are no set class times. You can learn when it works best for you. Courses are offered in a prescribed schedule.

Work experience requirements are completed in your workplace. If you have learning and work experience in the ECE field and can demonstrate your knowledge and skills, you may be eligible for **PLAR (Prior Learning and Recognition)** credit.

After completing the ECE diploma, students can apply for **Level 2 Classification** under the Early Learning and Child Care Act and Regulation.

Admission requirements:

- High School Graduation Diploma or equivalent.
- Self-identify as Mi'kmaw/Indigenous and reside in Nova Scotia.
- Possess one or more of the following:
 - Entry Level Orientation
 - Level 1 Classification
 - School-Aged Training Approval
- Be currently employed with a mimimum 1 year experience and as an ECE in a licensed child care centre, pre-primary program Mi'kmaw Preschool/Daycare or Jordan Principle Support for Early Years in Nova Scotia equivalent to 1,080 hours or more per year.
- Be able to work a minimum of 15 hours per week while in the ECE program with the ability to complete work experiences in your place of work.

Funding:

Tuition, student fees, textbooks and other program cost are fully covered through funding from the **Department of Education and Early Childhood Development.**
