Specific Job Components

A teacher at Soochow shall perform the tasks assigned by the school principal. These tasks may vary from time to time with the evolution of the organization and may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- (b) Incorporate knowledge of a variety of learning styles and know how they impact learning;
- (c) Develop and maintain long-range and daily instructional plans;
- (d) Maintain complete records on each student as a basis to inform intervention;
- (e) Use a variety of teaching strategies such as wait time, questioning, discussion, and other cooperative teaching techniques;
- (f) Use appropriate techniques to encourage active participation while communicating a caring attitude and trust of students;
- (g) Promote problem-solving, cooperative negotiating skills and conflict resolution strategies;
- (h) Develop healthy self-esteem in students;
- (i) Promote and maintain confidentiality regarding records and documentation;
