Students at Ellenvale Jr. High & Graham Creighton Jr. High participated in the Kitchen Brigrades Program. The program was offered through La Tablee des Chefs, providing students with the opportunity to participate in culinary workshops led by a professional chef. The workshops teach students basic culinary skills and healthy eating while building relationships with their peers. Youth are divided into groups by skill level and compete weekly for points as they learn skills and complete food challenges.

At the end of the program, Ellenvale and Graham Creighton will have an opportunity to compete for an exclusive paid trip to Montreal to complete in the final challenge.

Chocolate fondue

Ingredients

- 4 cups (1 L) your choice of fruits
- ²/₃ cup (160 ml or 100 g) dark chocolate (Fair-trade, if possible)

Preparation

DOUBLE BOILER TECHNIQUE

- 1 In a small saucepan, pour about 10 cm of water and place a medium size metal bowl on top (water should not touch the bowl).
- 2 Heat over medium heat until simmering (water
- 3 Place chocolate in the bowl over saucepan and stir until melted.
- 4 Remove bowl from saucepan. Set aside.

ASSEMBLING

- 5 Spread parchment paper about 60 cm long on work surface.
- 6 Arrange cut fruit on parchment paper
- 7 Drizzle melted chocolate over fruit.

 saucepan (small)

- spatula


One of the student's favourite pieces of the summit was the Mental

The scavenger hunt was a fun filled activity. Participants were given clues to a location in or around the school that are places to "go to find someone to talk to", if they are struggling. After finding each station, they unscrambled words found with each clue to discover a mystery phrase and win the scavenger hunt! It was a close race, but we could only have one winner! Not only were we able to help people learn about our school and the places where they can find support, but we made it fun and provided students with mental health awareness.

UPCOMING FALL EVENTS 2022

Staff in the Citadel Family of Schools identified a barrier, to accessing Halal meat products in central Halifax, especially those who struggle with food security. The availability of Halal products is limited and expensive. Facilitators Sharon Steeves, Darine Elsahli, and Kim Gariepy were creative with their Market Bucks program this year. They used grant money received from the Farmer's Market Association and Halifax Brewery Farmer's Market to connect with local farmers directly to bring items to the local family resource centres where a market was created with cultural foods and fresh produce locally in their community. They also received a grant is for \$5000 for new and creative ideas to help address food security in Nova Scotia. The team had only 2 days to make a grant proposal to this program, but Kim was able to get it done!




Students at Auburn Drive High School had a presenter from the Youth Cannabis Awareness program visit as part of 'Wellness Wednesdays' at the school!

"Break the Silence" Conference: The Cape Breton Victoria Regional Centre for Education's SchoolsPlus Program and Family Service of Eastern Nova Scotia held a one-day conference called "Break the Silence" on November 9th, 2022 at the Horizon Achievements Center, bringing together over 70 students from over eleven High Schools within the region.

The goal of the conference is to prevent sexualized violence by raising awareness and education on consent, the identification of red flags and warning signs in an unhealthy relationship, and information on how to access services. Through first-voice accounts, students heard testimonials on sexual violence with a primary focus on how they navigated their journey toward hope and recovery. Students came together as a school team to brainstorm ways to take the information they learned from the conference and share it with their larger school student body.

Conference is funded by a \$5000.00 'Sexual Violence Strategy' grant, Dept. of Community Services.







Lions supporting students, outside school

The Kingston Lions Club have recently launched a new program called Lions After the Bell to address food insecurity among young people in our community. Each week the club puts together small bags of non-perishable food to be delivered to the participating schools by Schools Plus. SchoolsPlus and other school staff identify students who could use the support.

Workshop topics include: -how to talk to kids about healthy boundaries -gaining confidence to talk to others and promote safety and much much more!





Food Fiesta



WHO: newcomers Students who may be experiencing food insecurity

WHAT: Food Fiesta, held a number of cooking classes, over the lunch hour that would focus will be how to focus on easy, health meals from a variety of cultures; learning to prepare the food that is are easy and healthy, and which students can "grab and go" in the morning to have fuel for learning for the day. Plans include invite participating students to share healthy recipes from their cultures, taking turns to teach each other, and celebrate our cultures.

So far we have made yogurt parfaits, smoothies, hummus and had a multicultural pot luck and Dabke *party where there was traditional syrian food, music and dancing! One of our teachers even joined in and danced! *Dabke is a Levantine folk dance, popular in Palestine, Jordan, Lebanon and Syria. Dabke combines circle dance and line dancing and is widely performed at weddings and other joyous occasions.

WHEN: Fall 2022 and continues throughout school year

WHERE: Halifax West High

WHY: This collaboration helps create community, provides skills and access to food. Students share with other students who drop by the YMCA Settlement room.

WHO: Grade 4 and 5 students from Bayview Community School, and New Germany Elementary school
