



Over 83 High schoolers (12 from CBVRCE, 1 from CSAP and 1 from MK) came together to enrich their knowledge about mental illness, and to learn about what is Stigma and how to reduce stigma in our schools.We also got an opportunity to hear from 3 first voice speakers who shared a message of hope, recovery, and the impact of stigma.

The goal of HEADSTRONG is to increase knowledge of mental health, mental illness and addictions, decrease stigma, and change current attitudes about mental health.

SchoolsPlus Community Outreach and Mi'kmaq Student Support Worker supporting Mental Health Wellness

Terri Pennell, Mi'kmaq student support worker and Muriel Thomas, SchoolsPlus Community Outreach Worker co-lead a mental Health Journal program throughout the school year, for young girls.

A mental health bullet journal is a place you can record your thoughts and feelings and support your mental well-being. Some ways include organizing your day, wellness trackers or a mood tracker, expressing your feelings through a brain storm or morning pages, self-care, wellness, triggers or practicing gratitude.

Staff worked with the girls to map out their bullet journals, insert self-care/wellness into their routine and give them skills to work through their triggers as well as build self-esteem and healthy habits/outlets.

The participants in our Options group at Hantsport School did an awesome job today exploring emotions on the "anger iceberg"! Great job, students!

ANNAPOLIS VALLEY REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION



WHO: Eleven youth , Grades Seven -Ten, Windsor and West Hants

WHAT: TRACKS program (TEENS REACH ABILITIES, Capacity, Knowledge & Success), a program to support youth employability skills. Created a TRACKS portfolio, looking at concepts, success, challenges and dreams. Modules will include topics like communication, problem solving, responsible digital citizenship, and more.

WHEN: Launched first module March Break 2023, to continue throughout the year.

WHERE: Windsor and West Hants

WHY: This program provides excellent career support; the plan is to link participants with hands on employability mentorship activities, offer excursions to increase experiential learning and provide supports for employment related activities and certifications. Youth ON TRACK to success!

CAPE BRETON-VICTORIA REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION



WHO: Grade 4 & 5 students,

WHAT: A book club, as requested by students, and facilitated by SchoolsPlus Community Outreach Workers. Students had the opportunity to pick their own book of interest and then would apply it to whatever theme they were working on in the book club (example: adventure, mystery, friendship, and comedy). Students made bookmarks and a poster outlining their book, created their own comic and played games related to the topic (collaborative story telling as a group and book charades)

WHEN: Weekly, over lunch period November 2022 - April 2023

WHERE: Mountainview Elementary

WHY: Developing a love of books, fun, and friendships

CHIGNECTO-CENTRAL REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION



WHO: SchoolsPlus Pictou County East & West: elementary and middle schools

WHAT: The Great Clothing Swap! Clothing items remain unclaimed following a Lost and Claim period; so clothing is laundered and swapped with another school. During breaks, lunch time, and even parent teacher meetings items were put out for students to 'shop'. All items were free of charge, and anything left over was donated. The Swap was advestised throgh school newsletter, and Facebook pages.

WHEN: The Great Clothing Swap happened over a few weeks, happening in each school when it best fits the school schedule.

WHY: This is a fun experience for all young students. Items are free, and students are not limited to a number of items. It is universal, but helps those in need, while teaching all students, reduce, reuse, recycle!





CONSEIL SCOLAIRE ACADIEN PROVINCIAL









WHO: Six families with SchoolsPlus and La Pirouette

WHAT: Slow Cooker Classes were held for three evenings. Ingredients for 3 recipes, per session, for 9 meals! Together we prepped and packaged the ingredients, enabling families to freeze them for future use. Families also got a slow cooker to take home.

WHEN: Winter 2022

WHERE: Ecole Secondaire de Par-en-bas

WHY: This provided opportunity for connectedness between families in the community and helped with the challenges of food security in the region

PARTNERS: Thanks to La Pirouette for providing all the funding for meals and the slow cooker!

HALIFAX REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION



WHO: Student at Lockview High School

WHAT: Student led, and student named, the **Neurodiversity Club** was formed by students with an interest in sharing time and space, at lunchtime. Additionally, doing an amazing job advocating for Autism Awareness month, helping other schools, and sells pins called Brainy buttons to help raise money and awareness for neurodiversity.

WHEN & WHERE: The SchoolsPlus Hub site every Wednesday

WHY: The goal was to provide a safe and welcoming space for individuals with autism to socialize and connect with others who share similar experiences, or may feel excluded from peer groups .This time provides opportunities to develop new skills, explore interests, build self-esteem and confidence.

The Neurodiversity Club has already engaged with advocacy in feeder schools, making autism acceptance month bulletins in AshLee Jefferson, Holland Elementary, George P Vanier, and other surrounding schools.







STRAIT REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION



WHO: Students at St. Andrew Junior school

WHAT: Wheels for Health, a project initiated by students to fix our current fleet of bicycles with assistance from an experienced repair person. Additionally, we purchased skateboards, and mountain bikes for our more experienced riders. The project supports students of all abilities from beginners to advanced.

WHEN: Throughout the Fall/Winter season

WHERE: Antigonish

WHY: The goals of the project are to educate youth about healthy living and the benefits of an active lifestyle, give students experiential learning on the maintenance and upkeep of their bicycle equipment and provide students with new opportunities with local recreational facilities.

PARTNERS: Thanks to our partners at the Department of Communities, Culture and Heritage, for the Recreation Community Development Grant! Their goal is to develop and promote our cultural resources for all Nova Scotians."

SOUTH SHORE REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION



WHO: The United Way of Lunenburg County/ SchoolsPlus partnership

WHAT: Enhanced Programs Supports- in 2023/24 \$39,500 was provided to help operate five programs. These programs included money to purchase internet plans, gas cards, new rural school recreation and cultural opportunities, hygiene & health, family counselling services. Since 2021 the United Way of Lunenburg County has invested \$88,650 in SchoolsPlus designed programming. SchoolsPlus staff can also access FREE refurbished bikes, gently used smartphones, swim/skate passes, free skates and helmets to borrow, warm gently used winterware, Bridgewater Transit passes, and gently used soccer equipment. SchoolsPlus families have access to over a dozen other youth programs including YMCA Youth programs, afterschool programs, rural transportation programs, Snoezelen room subsidies, sport, recreation, and cultural activity subsidies and 211.



WHERE: Lunenburg and Queen's County

WHY: United Way coordinator Michael Graves says that "SchoolsPlus is a great community partner. Staff know the families and communities that struggle and the resources they need to move forward. SchoolsPlus staff can act quickly in a very close-dective manner. The United Way of Lunenburg County sees SchoolsPlus as being a great investment. Keep up the great work".

The United Way of Lunenburg County has also made a 5-year \$70,000 commitment to help support the RootED School Food Program.



TRI-COUNTY REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION

WHO: Students Grade 6-8

WHAT: *Mijisinej* (me-gee-sin-edge) which means Let's Eat! Sharing and trying healthy and sometimes new foods, including traditional Mi'kmaq foods amongst our Indigenous and SchoolsPlus students in the spirit of peace and friendship. Simple Mi'kmaq language was taught during this time depending on the foods we were trying at the time.

WHEN: Bi-monthly, usually Wednesday or Thursdays

WHERE: Maple Grove Education Centre

WHY: This activity is key to our response to the calls of Truth and Reconciliation, the promotion and exchange of knowledge, the basis upon which to build lasting friendships









PARTNERS: Terri Pennell - The Mi'kmaq student support worker and Muriel Thomas, SP Community Outreach Worker ran the program throughout the school year
