SEX TRAFFICKING

A Survivors Perspective

Workshop for Service Providers

Presenter: Karly Church

This workshop will define domestic sex trafficking and debunk common myths and misconceptions to paint a picture of what human trafficking looks like in an Canadian context. The instructor will speak to her lived experience as a survivor of domestic sex trafficking in a way to help participants understand what domestic sex trafficking looks like and the vulnerabilities that could make someone susceptible to being trafficked. This is done to further explain the stages of commercial exploitation focusing on why people stay with their traffickers and the difficulties faced when exiting. Karly will discuss warning signs to equip individuals with how to identify the red flags of trafficking. She will speak to the importance of meeting all of an individual's unique basic needs, and the support and services available to assist in meeting those needs. Lastly, the importance of understanding healthy relationships, vulnerabilities and consent will be highlighted to support participants to feel empowered!

This free workshop is open to anyone who works with vulnerable populations







ANNAPOLIS VALLEY REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION

After the Bell: Food Security





WHO: Horton Family SchoolsPlus, in partnership with Wolfville Lions Clubs

WHAT: The Lions "After the Bell Food Security Support Program". Volunteers from the Wolfville Lions Club purchase and create packages of food for students experiencing food insecurity. The packages are to be taken home over the weekend, and include items to cover two days' worth of breakfast, snacks, and lunch for Saturdays and Sundays, i.e. days when students who normally could receive food support at school (like breakfast programs and lunch programs) cannot access those school supports. SchoolsPlus work with other school staff to determine need, provides this information to the Lions.

WHEN: Each week during the school year (minus first week of school, holiday break, and March Break)

WHERE: Eight schools within the Horton catchment (and the Wolfville Lions Club)

WHY: To support students experiencing food insecurity over the weekend, , to support their physical and mental health/wellness by having access to food



CAPE BRETON-VICTORIA REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION The Amazing Race

WHO: Organized By Riverview Family of Schools, but open to all families Grade P-8 throughout CBVRCE

WHAT: Discovering Nature: Stations were set up along the Knowledge Path with a variety of activities for families to engage in. Families enjoyed making nature-based paint, exploring nature through microscopes, making rainbows out of recycled materials, making animal footprints out of moulds and learning how to set up a tent.



Who: Leadership Group

What: Prepare care packages for local seniors home. Each package included homemade biscuits, preserves, tea, fun games, and a letter from a student. Students tried out several recipes, sharing and testing them with school staff in order to discover the best biscuits to place in each care package. Students then packaged the treats and delivered them to a local senior's care home.

When: Spring/Summer 2022

Where: Trenton Middle School (Celtic Family of Schools)

Why: Students developed leadership skills, while connecting with seniors, and thinking about the importance of service to others

CONSEIL SCOLAIRE ACADIEN PROVINCIAL Babysitting Course

Who: Clare area youth between 12 and 15 years old (not limited to CSAP students)

What: Following a Home Alone course, it was timely to offer a Babysitting course - just in time for Summer break! Many youth are already starting to stay home alone for short periods of time or care for younger siblings, this program gives them safety tools and confidence. Offered them a free program and transportation to the High School. The central location of the school in the community and the late pick up time, parents were able to pick up their kids easily after their busy work day.

Where : École secondaire de Clare, Meteghan River

Why: There is a major shortage in babysitters in our area, Home Alone and Babysitting courses are always in high demand.

HALIFAX REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION Level Up!













Who: 393 students transitioning from Elementary to Junior High, or Junior to Senior High

What: Level Up is a free 2-day camp that supports students with the transition to junior or senior high school. Participants joined with students from other feeder schools to develop time management skills, independent living skills (ex. how to prepare lunches and nutritious snacks, mastering locker combinations,). Additionally, self care activities included managing anxious feelings through engaging in mindfulness. Students participated in cooperative and competitive games, leadership activities that included a few water balloon fights, art projects, cultural experiences, slime making, and plenty of opportunities to joke and play!

When: July- August 2022

Where: Level Up was offered across 13 sites in the HRCE

Why: Transitions can be difficult, and the camp helps students identify and address their fears in a fun and supportive environment



STRAIT REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION Hiking in Arisaig

Who: 8 students from 3 Antigonish area schools (Saint Andrew's Junior School/Antigonish Education Center/HM MacDonald Maryvale).

What: Hiking in the Arisaig Park trail system which also included a storybook trail sponsored by the Municipality of the County of Antigonish. Trail led to a secluded waterfall, where students enjoyed dipping their toes into the water, exploring the rock formations around the area. Snacks provided by SchoolsPlus were had on the beach and ending the day with a packed picnic lunch in the Picnic Park.


