A Sacred Gathering: Truth and ReconciliACTION

One hundred students from schools throughout CBVRCE, gathered at Sydney Academy, for a ceremony to unveil and honour a breathtakingly beautiful sculpture, created with more than 200 fish painted by 440 students from 15 CBVRCE and Maueltuey Kin'matno'kuom.

One side of each fish was painted by an Indigenous student and the other by a non-indigenous student. Throughout the year long project, students exchanged letters stating what reconciliation meant to them, and actions they can take to move towards it

meant to them, and actions they can take to move towards it.

After lunch the group attended the SA Mawio'mi (Pow Wow). The sculpture is a visual representation of Etuaptmumk which is a Mi'kmaq word for two -eyed seeing.

Etuaptmumk is the guiding principle of learning to see from one eye with the strengths of Indigenous knowledges and ways of knowing, and from the other eye with the strengths of Western knowledge and ways of knowing, and learning to use both eyes together, for the benefit of all.



"Removing the Mask" Adolescent Grief Group

For over a decade, this unique program has been available to youth (grade 5-12) in Cape Breton Regional Municipality. The program is designed to work with the reality and uniqueness of one's grief story and begin to "unmask" the complicated processes that youth find themselves in after they have lost a loved one by death.

This program has been made possible through the strong partnership between Bereaved Families of Cape Breton (BFCB) and SchoolsPlus, CBVRCE. Facilitated by two Master of Social Workers we are able to promote, connect and register youth as well as prepare and execute the program over 6 weeks within a safe space.

"Removing the Mask" has had a tremendous impact for many adolescents over the past ten years. Our experience shows the participants' path becomes clearer as they try to reinvent their world without the person/people they have lost. This group provides the space for the teens to share personal stories with peers. They are breaking down the walls and barricades of avoidance and building relationships that foster acceptance, courage, reinvention, and healing.

We take pride in the narrative that is reflected, an enormous validity of the value of the program.

Since the beginning, a lot of youth have been brave enough to face their grief and we are extremely pleased that, with the collaboration of BFOCB, we can offer "Removing the Mask" to help them through this emotionally difficult time.

Roots of Empathy

Fifteen SchoolsPlus staff joined their community partners in a three-day training on August 30-Sept 1st, to bring Roots of Empathy to classrooms throughout NS. Roots of Empathy is an evidencebased classroom program for Primary to Grade Eight school students, promoting children's social and emotional competence. Students in Roots of Empathy classrooms are coached to connect with the vulnerability and humanity of an infant who visits throughout the school year with their parent/guardians, along with a Roots of Empathy Instructor, using a continuously updated curriculum. 
 Together we had many amazing adventures, here are some highlights:










Sneakers and Backpacks for Students.

WHO: Horton High and North Kings Education Centre

WHAT: Boredom Busters, building on previous year success, SchoolsPlus Facilitators and Community Outreach Workers developed six sessions with lots of flexibility and support to attend fun-filled events from board games to community outings, and enjoying pizza.

WHEN: July 5th – Cineplex Movie & Games at the Arcade July 12th – Wolfville Pizza Oven for Outdoor Games and Make-Your-Own-Pizza

July 20th – Bowling and Pizza Lunch at Avon Valley Lanes July 26th – Touring the Greenwood Aviation Museum + Picnic Lunch

August 2nd – Observing Animals at Oaklawn Farm Zoo August 9th – A "Paint Day" of Paint-Based Crafts and T-Shirt Decorating at Horton High School

WHERE: Various locations, with transportation support provided through SP Community Outreach workers (SPCOW).

WHY: SchoolsPlus and School Counsellors recognized that middle and high school youth in Rural NS often face isolation and boredom during the summer months. This program allows SchoolsPlus and other community partners to stay connected with youth by providing summer activities. Students advised they had enjoyed the food, the time with other students, and the chance to make friends while trying new activities.

CAPE BRETON-VICTORIA REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION

WHO: Student leaders in the Headstrong Group in Whitney Pier Memorial

WHAT: Students launched an awareness campaign, raising funds for the event through a raffle. In conjunction with the spirit of Mental Health week, the group organized a student-led event to discuss mental health, with the goal of a community awareness campaign. They designed and made hundreds of buttons for distribution to the community with both personal and mass messages; supporting and discussing the presence and effects of mental health among youth.

During an extended lunch period they organized a table in the common area handing out their handmade buttons and offering to discuss mental health with their school community. Students who participated were asked to sign the table and encouraged to write a message for others.

WHO: A group of Grade 9 and 10 female (female-identifying) students at J.L. Ilsley High School





WHO: Students ages 16-19 years, and youth preparing to live on their own.



WHY: This program was created for youth to gain common 'adulting' and life skills needed to be successful when living independently.


PARTNERS: SPCOWs from Yarmouth and Digby collaborated to develop and deliver this program.
