The "orange shirt" in Orange Shirt Day refers to the new shirt that Phyllis Webstad was given by her grandmother for her first day of school at St. Joseph's Mission residential school in British Columbia. When Phyllis got to school, they took away her clothes, including her new shirt. It was never returned. To Phyllis, the colour orange has always been a reminder of her experiences at residential school and, as she has said, "how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and I felt like I was worth nothing. All of us little children were crying and no one cared."

Today we honor Phyllis story, by wearing an orange shirt!





## ANNAPOLIS VALLEY REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION Chilled Teens Anxiety Group


Who: SchoolsPlus Mental Health Clinicians. West Hants Middle School students in grade 7 and 8


Why: The aim of Chilled is to help participants; build skills, spend less time worrying, and gain confidence

#### Who: Grade 9 students.

What: SchoolsPlus staff are currently offering 'Healthy Relationships' programming that focuses on topics from the Healthy Relationships for Youth curriculum, developed by the Antigonish Women's Centre. The topics include healthy relationships; communication; boundaries; stereotypes and pop culture; hyper-sexualization and hyper-masculinity; consent; and drug and alcohol usage.

## CONSEIL SCOLAIRE ACADIEN PROVINCIAL Nourish Your Roots

Who: SchoolsPlus CSAP Central Region, CSAP Parent Navigator, CSAP African Nova Scotia student support workers, Nourish Your Roots and a nutritionist.

What: Nourish your Roots was offering a grant for emergency funding for food efforts. SchoolsPlus offered family food boxes that had healthy recipes for school lunch and snacks ideas. The recipes that we offered the families were recipes encouraged to be prepared as a family activity. The families were provided with all the ingredients to make the recipes. Each food box was worth approximately \$125. We were able to provide boxes for 24 families in our metro school as well as for École Acadienne de Truro & Center Scolaire de la Rive-Sud. We asked a nutritionist that had worked in our schools, to provide us with healthy recipes.




Why: This event was designed to create a safe space for girls in Queens County and connect them with positive female role models in a skateboarding community.

### TRI-COUNTY REGIONAL CENTRE FOR EDUCATION Free Store

Who :Digby Regional High School, St. Mary's Bay Academy and Digby Elementary School in Tri-County Regional Centre for Education.

**Partners :**The Digby County SP team (2 Community Outreach Workers, 2 Child & Youth Care Practitioners, 1 Parent Navigator and 1 SchoolsPlus Facilitator) continue to focus on supporting students & their families. In collaboration with multiple community partners, they are supporting families through the many challenges of navigating through Covid-19. Partners include TCRCE; Farm Market: Superstore; Clothing retailer; Digby and Area Community Health Board

What : "Free Stores" have been set up in schools to provide students in need of non-perishable food item snacks clothing& hygiene products. The schools entered a partnership with a local Farm Market to create a Food Box Program. Once a week a family is identified, to receive a box of meat, fruit, vegetables etc. The Food for Thought Program partnered to provide a lunch program offered to the students of both DRHS & DES. Virtual Cooking Classes were offered by The Superstore and hosted by their Dietitian. The Superstore provided participants with cooking kits. One of our schools received clothing donations such as winter coats, hats, mittens, etc. A local retailer hosted a winter clothing drive. The High School called it - The Clothesline! Wellness funds were received from the Digby & Area Community Health Board along with substantial supports from community members to purchase 20 pairs of snow pants and 2 winter jackets, for the elementary school.



When : Throughout the Fall and Winter of 2020-21

WHY : This focused effort and partnership was in recognition of the challenges imposed by COVID-19, and to support our students return to school in the best way possible.

## **SchoolsPlus Value our Partnerships**

Our partners engage at all levels of delivery within our school communities. Additionally SchoolsPlus staff benefit from the numerous professional development collaborations with other organizations, enabling us to keep our knowledge and skills up to date while benefiting from cross-disciplinary approaches and networks.



Here are a few SP Partnership Highlights:

The Annapolis Royal Home Hardware toy drive helped many families this Christmas season. Home Hardware partnered with SchoolsPlus to have the toys distributed to families in our area who could use a helping hand this holiday. The spirit of Christmas was shared by all in this endeavor.

Annapolis SchoolsPlus received a \$350 donation from Inclusive **Opportunities Association** in October 2020. **Executive Director** Jaymee-lynne Dowell said "I'm so glad we could help! Your programs help make inclusion and accessibility possible by providing opportunities for students who may deal with a financial barrier to access the same things other kids can access."



## **SchoolsPlus Value our Partnerships**

Who: SchoolsPlus team in Antigonish partnered with Family Services of Eastern Nova Scotia (FSENS) to create the SchoolsPlus Community Bike Shop

Partners: SchoolsPlus, FSEN, Standing Together Initiative (An initiative to prevent domestic violence)

What: Through a grant form the Standing Together Initiative, SchoolsPlus and FSEN teamed up to purchase a shed and equipment to enhance their bicycle program.

The shop is a beautiful 12' by 14' all season shed, equipped with a dozen bikes, scooters, and helmets to accompany children of all genders and ages. Along with providing students with a fun and healthy activity, it also doubles as a repair shop.

#### Strait Regional Community Garden

We have been involved for the past three years with the garden and our students help to plant and grow seedlings in their classrooms. Our students from Pre-Primary to Grade 8, the local daycare and Family Place's "mom and tot group" come out to help plant, till and harvest from the Helping Hands Community Garden. This partnership has been a great opportunity to work with the community as well as engage intergenerationally as the garden is located at our local senior home. All produce is given to our local food bank as well as families in need who are facing food security issues, especially this year. Not only have our students learned the importance of growing their own food but also have helped build, repair, and nature our garden.

When available, RCMP have donated bikes that require repairs and some of the older students work on the bikes and donate to families. This shop allows SchoolsPlus staff to conveniently engage in a fun and healthy activity during and after school with our students. The bikes provide not only great exercise for all, but also a tremendous way to bond with the students.

When: Bike program is ongoing, but the shed is an exciting milestone opened early Fall Where: Antigonish, Antigonish Education Centre, Saint Andrew Junior School, and Dr JH Gillis Regional High School,

Why: Provides a great afterschool hobby for students of all ages

Quote from Student: Students excitedly await their turn in the shed. A grade 6 student said "My day in the shed is on Thursday and I look forward to it all week! It is the highlight of my week and I just love it".
