The work is related to the systemic inequalities which have resulted in unequal access to learning opportunities, achievement, and benefits.

Researchers are asked to identify practices that support positive learning environments and opportunities for African Nova Scotian, Mi'kmaw students, and or students who are experiencing economic exclusion/poverty in Nova Scotia that can have an impact on student achievement and well-being by conducting research in one or more of the following areas:
